

Call for applications

Post-doctoral fellowship on cannabis among 2S/LGBTQIA+ youth

Professors Olivier Ferlatte and Rod Knight of the Centre for Public Health Research (CReSP) and the École de Santé Publique de l'Université de Montréal invite applications for a full-time postdoctoral position with the Cannapix project, funded by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research and the Fonds de recherche du Québec.

Cannapix is a multi-method, participatory research project (qualitative, quantitative, artistic research) on cannabis and its impacts on the mental health of 2S/LGBTQIA+ youth.

The postdoctoral fellow will integrate Qollab, a research lab directed by Olivier Ferlatte and located at l'École de Santé Publique de l'Université de Montréal. Qollab is a community-based, collaborative research lab that promotes the participation of 2S/LGBTQIA+ people in research. Focused on a better understanding of mental health and substance use issues, Qollab aims to support the development of health promotion for 2S/LGBTQIA+ communities.

The responsibilities and challenges of the position:

- Supervise data collection activities;
- Analyzed qualitative (and potentially quantitative) data;
- Produce research reports and scientific publications;
- Provide mentoring to students and research staff;
- Participate in the scientific activities of the Cannapix project;
- Participate in the writing of grant applications related to the project.

The person we are looking for:

- Holds a Ph.D. (or has submitted a doctoral dissertation) in one of the following fields: Public Health, Psychology, Sociology, Sexology or a related discipline;
- Possesses strong qualitative methods and qualitative data analysis skills;
- Demonstrates an interest or has skills in community-based and participatory research (experience with photovoice and cellphilms methods an asset);
- Skills and experience in quantitative research (survey data analysis) an asset;
- Possesses good communication and writing skills in English and French;
- Knowledge of cannabis and/or other substance use and mental health issues.
- Has experience in supervising students;
- Demonstrates interest in and/or has experience conducting research with 2S/LGBTQIA+ individuals;
- Is able to work independently and demonstrates academic productivity.

Details of the offer

The salary is \$50,000 per year. The mandate is for one year with a possibility of extension.

The postdoctoral fellow will benefit from all the resources offered by the Université de Montréal, including training directed to this audience. As a student member of CReSP, the fellow will have privileged access to funding and career development opportunities.

To apply:

The application must include the following:

- A cover letter;
- A curriculum vitae;
- An academic text written within the last two years;
- Transcript of doctoral studies (if applicable).
- The name and information (phone number and email) of three references.
